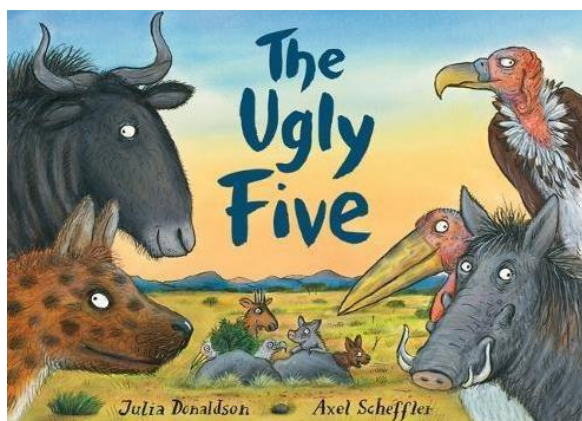
## This week's awards...
