Welcome

 reminder that it is important to do daily. Confidence in reading and reading for pleasure will come with a
 good reading habit and when parents also show their child an interest in their reading too. Mrs
 Charlesworth has started a book club with her class and is reading her own book alongside the children
 reading theirs. It has made a big impact on them wanting to read and be part of the lunchtime club.

Smart appearance: We continue to emphasise the importance of looking smart by wearing our full school uniform including correct PE Kit. Please support your child in ensuring they are dressed appropriately (including footwear) in our school uniform and have a full and correct PE kit for each week (no football / branded red tops).

Attendance: What a difference your support of good attendance has made this last term. We hit **97.5**% as a whole school which is outstanding! Please do continue to have your child(ren) in school as much as possible, even with the sniffles.
